FIREWOOD BANK SAFETY CHAIN SAWS

A. PROPER SAFETY CLOTHING

Gloves

Steel toe boots

Helmet

Chaps

- Eye protection
- Ear protection
- No loose clothing (to avoid

becoming tangled in equipment)

B. KNOW YOUR EQUIPMENT

1. Read the chain saw user manual!

2. Identify the safety features on your chain saw (chain brake, front and rear hand guards, chain catcher, stop switch, vibration damper, throttle trigger lockout, etc.).

C. PREPARE YOUR CHAIN SAW

A chain saw that is in good condition is a safer and easier to operate chain saw.

- Need sharpening? Follow the instructions in your chain manual to sharpen the chain.
- Loose chain? All chains stretch- follow manufacturer's recommendations on chain tension.
- Well oiled? Good lubrication will extend a saw's life.



D. BASIC OPERATING SAFETY TIPS

- 1. Never refuel a hot engine.
- 2. Never drop start a saw! Holding a saw with only one hand does not allow for proper control over the swinging action that the bar will make.
- 3. Have a plan in mind before starting the saw. Walking around with a started saw only increases the risk of injury.
